Amendment Proposal #2

We want to send 6 teachers to a math instructional workshop for training on a math program that we want to incorporate next year. This costs 1,900 and we would like to propose that we take that out of the carry over funds.

Amendment Proposal #3

This year for our book club party we are having an illustrator and author come and our cost for both of them will total \$1400 and we only budgeted \$500.

Amendment Proposal #4

We proposed to change the measurement for K-2 students on our math goal (#2) to use i ready math assessment for the K-2 grades and keep the Moby Max assessment for the 3-6 grades.

Review of goals and progress on them

18-19 Goal #1

82 % of all students will be on or above grade level at the end of the school year in reading as measured by the Fountass and Pinnell and the Dibels assessments.

As of today and recent testing data:

Dibels is currently at 68.6% and F&P is currently at 54.6%. We are on our way and with a great 3rd term it is very possible to meet our goals.

18-19 Goal #2

83% of all students will be on or above or make a years progress in math based on the end of year Moby Max assessment.

As of today on Moby Max it is showing that 42.8% of the students have met this goal. Please note that not all teachers have administered a mid year test on this program. It is not required for them to do so. Because of this it is more difficult to tell how close we really are currently. With our great attendance and past track record I anticipate reaching this goal.

Possible Goals for next years plan:

The council agrees that Math and Reading are at the top of the list and some expenditures were suggested as we move toward putting the 2019-2020 plan together at our next council meeting on March 12th.
