Carry-Over

Our carry-over this year is higher than the 10% recommended. We are purchasing a new phonics program and anticipate that more materials and training will be required for the program to get started. We also hired a new band teacher, who will need to assess instrument viability and the need for more music apparatus as he inventories and plans for the upcoming school year. We would like to be prepared with funding available when the council can resume in the fall for an amendment to the plan which can include the Arts program.

Funding Changes

With increased distribution, we may purchase student devices and or teacher and classroom technology. We may buy more professional development opportunities to help us achieve our goals. We may buy more library books for student use and check-out and home reading programs. We may purchase more decodable texts to match our reading and language arts program. We may purchase more consumables for our math program for student use if we have an influx of new students. We may purchase more classroom supplies as needed for project work or hands-on learning activities.
