What is Title I?

- Passed in 1965 under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). It is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools.
- These supplemental funds provide students the opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and help to close educational achievement gaps.

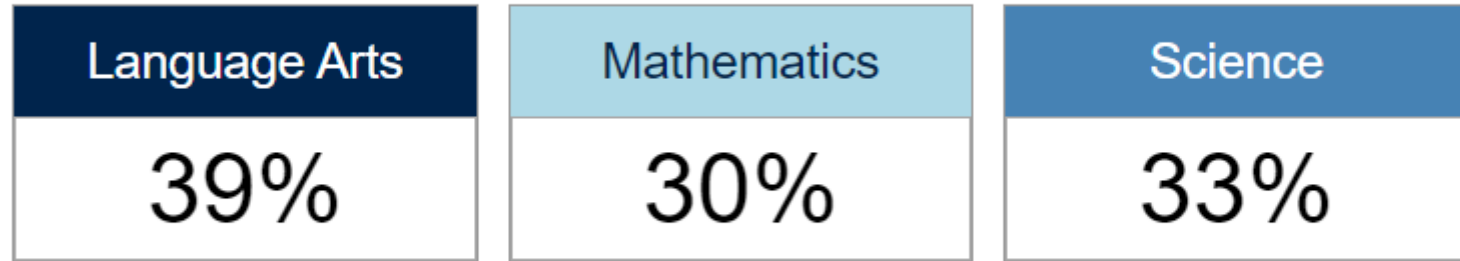


How does Eureka Elementary use Title I funds?

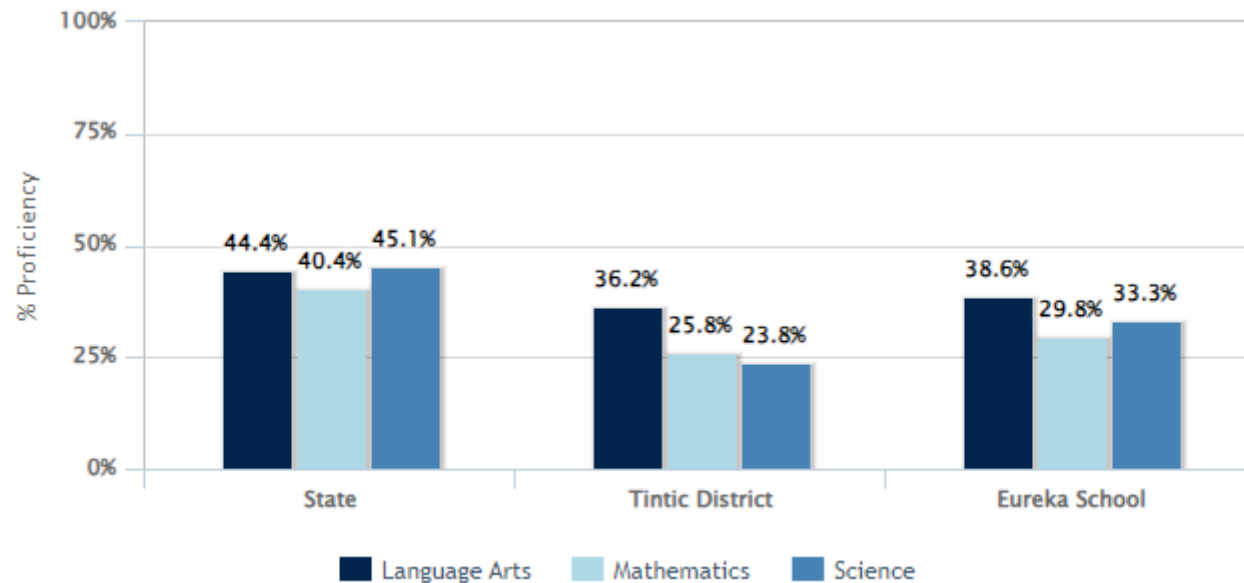
- Schoolwide program; funds go to upgrade the entire education program of the school.
- For 2023-2024, Eureka Elementary and Tintic School District have chosen to focus Title I funds on reading skills in grades K-3.
- All of our funding goes to staffing. One teachers aide and the principal are paid partly through Title I funds.

Student Proficiency Results for Eureka School

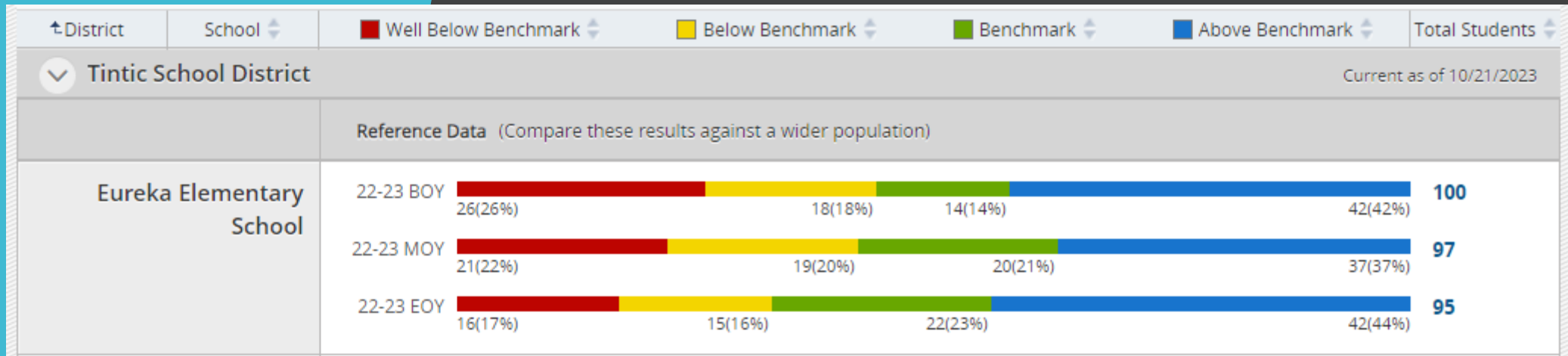


2023 % of Students Proficient

School-Parent Compact

- A written commitment that outlines how the entire school community—teachers, families, and students—will share the responsibility for improved academic achievement.
- The Compact is signed at registration (not required)
- Posted on school's [website](#) Hover over Documents, select Title 1, then you will see the compact.

Rights of Parents to be Involved

The annual Title I meeting **must inform parents and family members of their right to be involved**. The following requirements of ESEA do not necessarily need to be reviewed during the annual meeting. However, schools and LEAs are required to provide the information, opportunities, and notices listed on following slides.

Participation in Title I



Parents and family members have the right to:

- Be involved in decisions made at the school and district level;
- Be provided with information on your child's level of achievement on tests in reading, math, and science;
- Request information on the qualifications of your child's teacher and paraprofessionals who are working with your child; and
- Request opportunities for regular meetings to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of your child.
