# Participation in Title I

### What is Title I?

- Passed in 1965 under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). It is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools.
- These supplemental funds provide students the opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and highquality education, and help to close educational achievement gaps.

## Participation in Title I



#### How does Eureka Elementary use Title I funds?

- Schoolwide program; funds go to upgrade the entire education program of the school.
- For 2023-2024, Eureka Elementary and Tintic School District have chosen to focus Title I funds on reading skills in grades K-3.
- All of our funding goes to staffing. One teachers aide and the principal are paid partly through Title I funds.

## Requirements of Title I



#### School-Parent Compact

- A written commitment that outlines how the entire school community—teachers, families, and students—will share the responsibility for improved academic achievement.
- The Compact is signed at registration (not required)
- Posted on school's website Hover over Documents, select Title 1, then you will see the compact.

## Rights of Parents to be Involved

The annual Title I meeting must inform parents and family members of their right to be involved. The following <u>requirements</u> of ESEA do not necessarily need to be reviewed during the annual meeting. However, schools and LEAs are required to provide the information, opportunities, and notices listed on following slides.

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#### Parents and family members have the right to:

- Be involved in decisions made at the school and district level;
- Be provided with information on your child's level of achievement on tests in reading, math, and science;
- Request information on the qualifications of your child's teacher and paraprofessionals who are working with your child; and
- Request opportunities for regular meetings to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of your child.
